


The Clockmaker's Daughter by Kate Morton (592 pages; 2018; recommended by Becky Rook) My real name, no one remembers. The truth about that summer, no one else knows. In the summer of 1862, a group of young artists led by the passionate and talented Edward

Radcliffe descends upon Birchwood Manor on the banks of the Upper Thames. Their plan: to spend a secluded summer month in a haze of inspiration and creativity. But by the time their stay is over, one woman has been shot dead while another has disappeared; a priceless heirloom is missing; and Edward Radcliffe's life is in ruins. Over one hundred and fifty years later, Elodie Winslow, a young archivist in London, uncovers a leather satchel containing two seemingly unrelated items: a sepia photograph of an arresting-looking woman in Victorian clothing, and an artist's sketchbook containing the drawing of a twin-gabled house on the bend of

a river. Why does Birchwood Manor feel so familiar to Elodie? And who is the beautiful woman in the photograph? Will she ever give up her secrets? Told by multiple voices across time, *The Clockmaker's Daughter* is a story of murder, mystery, and thievery, of art, love and loss. And flowing through its pages like a river, is the voice of a woman who stands outside time, whose name has been forgotten by history, but who has watched it all unfold: Birdie Bell, the clockmaker's daughter.

Educated by Tara Westover (336 pages; 2018; recommended by Betty Kueker)



Born to survivalists in the mountains of Idaho, Tara Westover was seventeen the first time she set foot in a classroom. Her family was so isolated from mainstream society that there was no one to ensure the children received an education, and no one to intervene when one of Tara's older brothers became violent. When another brother got himself into college, Tara decided to try a new kind of life. Her quest for knowledge transformed her, taking her over oceans and across continents, to Harvard and to Cambridge University. Only then would she wonder if she'd traveled too far, if there was still a way home. We hope to see you all in July!

FINANCIAL HEALTH OF OUCC by Lois Schmidt

End of May General Fund account balance is \$600.32. This is a drop in our balance of approximately \$4500. June will mean quarterly payments are due, so it is important that our General Fund giving remains steady.

Total matching funds received as of June 9th is \$16,651. The south parking lot is finished, however, we are not expected to pay for the work until 30 days after the back parking lot work is done. Since this figure and the donor's matching funds are sufficient to cover parking lot costs, the remaining funds will go toward tuckpointing expenses. A special thanks to all who are contributing to make our goal of \$20,000 possible!

It appears our General Fund is beginning to experience the "summer slump". We hope everyone will make an effort to make weekly contributions regardless if you are sitting in the pew, enjoying a vacation or have other events which keep you from attending services.

WOMEN'S GUILD
